

Judy Moermond is a Cincinnatian through and through, having lived in the area for all of her life. She currently lives in Cherry Grove, which is not far from her roots in Anderson Township. She has three sons, Ben, Matt and Josh. Those sons are being covered more than others of our many Friendship Force offspring have been. The reason? Ben and Matt have had their lives impacted by the virus, and I wanted to share a sense of the collateral damage the virus can do. Grace Murdoch grew up in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She came to the states to go to college, as there were greater educational opportunities available for women here than there were in Canada at the time. She did her undergraduate work at Asbury College, a Liberal Arts college near Lexington KY. She met her husband Norman there when they were both undergraduates. They came to Cincinnati after graduation for the job opportunities offered to them by the University of Cincinnati (UC). They both received their PhD`s from UC and they both were at UC for 35 years. Norman taught History for the 35 years, and Grace taught Psychology for 30 years and was in Administration for 5 years. She had a private practice for a

part of that time; also three children: two sons and one daughter. After they retired, they moved to Medford OR, near where their son lived. They had 21 acres and three horses, one of which was born in their barn. That horse came with her to Cincinnati when she returned here in 2015 after her husband died. Her Cincinnati granddaughter is an equestrienne, and rides that formerly from Oregon horse.

Norman had been diagnosed with Alzheimer`s, and Grace was with him for the six years of what Nancy Reagan so gently called the long goodbye. Grace is enjoying the Friendship Force kind of travel in which you really get to know people as individuals. She has been to New Zealand with our club and to Ecuador and Columbia on an exchange with people from various clubs. Like so many of us, she is looking forward to life returning to something more normal.

Mimi Bailey is originally from a suburb outside of Philadelphia; she currently lives in the Finneytown area. She came to Cincinnati to attend U.C. and majored in social work and has a BSW. After working as a social worker for seven years, her later positions were outside of that field. She was an event planner for many years and then became a corporate concierge and did that for nine years. She eventually was a manager for LesConcierges, a West Coast Company and managed 11 concierges around the country for Fidelity Investments for another nine years. She is now working in her originally chosen career, in an Employee Assistance Program located in Tri-County. As for her family and personal life, there was a period when she stayed home to raise



her two children. Her son lives in the Landen area with his family, and her daughter lives in Columbus, OH, with her family. She keeps busy in her personal life as a member of a book club (Wine, Women and Words) as well as the Vineyard Church.
